Book Review - Crazy About Gardening

Two decades ago,
Canadian author Des
Kennedy laid down his
spading fork long enough
to pick up a pen and
consider some of the
pleasures and perils of
gardening. This book of
essays is the thoughtful,


humorous result. Kennedy lives on Vancouver Island, where everything is different from Colorado: climate, soil, plants, plant names, birds, measurements (meters and hectares), and even the weeds! And yet, his themes are universal. We all want what he wants—a productive, color-coordinated, weed-free, fragrant, environmental garden. And we all struggle with the same

challenges that he faces.

But few of us have his way with words. How about this? "Weeding might appear to be the systematic elimination of plants well suited to a site in order that ill-suited exotics might languish there a little longer." Or this? "Maybe that little clump of mugho pines, hastily parachuted in several years ago to provide 'structure,' now resembles a depressing huddle of mourners at a pauper's funeral." I was fortunate to receive this book at the 2014 State Convention, and enjoyed every sentence of it. If you are looking for a good read or great gift for your gardening friends during the holidays consider *Crazy About Gardening* and you won't go wrong.

Flora of Colorado

If you've ever been frustrated attempting to key out a plant (and who hasn't), a solution is on the way! It's the new, soon-to-be-published, Flora of Colorado by Jennifer Ackerfield. This is much more than a

superior, and easier-to-use key. It certainly is that, but more importantly it's a comprehensive guide to all of the vascular plants of Colorado with detailed descriptions, distribution maps, habitat information, flowering times and elevation ranges for every species. Color photographs are included for about a third of the species, including those most commonly encountered and those most difficult to identify.

Ackerfield teaches plant identification classes at Colorado State University, where she is the Collections Manager for the herbarium. With over 20 years of experience traveling across the state of Colorado studying its plants, she has documented the rich floristic diversity of the state in Flora of Colorado. Her primary objective is to make the identification and appreciation of Colorado's native plants accessible to almost anyone. Part of that process has been the field-testing of the pre-published keys by experts and non-experts alike.

Reviews have been universally enthusiastic, especially when it comes to ease-of-use. This guide and related keys avoid the "micro-splitting" of subtle details evident in other keys, while at the same time improving accuracy by using science-based phylogenies. In short, this comprehensive manual of Colorado's native plants, along with the user-friendly keys needed to identify them, will be absolutely essential to those of us who want to know more about Colorado's native plants. This book is large (see spec's on the publisher's website) because it includes the entire state – both

the Eastern and Western slopes – in a single volume. In my view, it's surprisingly affordable at \$65, especially considering all of the color photography.

It's completed and ready to go to print, with availability planned for spring of next year, 2015. Before that can happen, however, the publisher requires a number of pre-orders that will help cover the cost of printing. By buying the book NOW, you can help get it printed and out-the-door, as scheduled. There's a 10% discount on all pre-orders, so the cost of the book comes down to \$58.50, and shipping is only \$4.50. Take a look at the below flyer from CoNPS, and the website, http://shop.brit.org/products/colorado flora. I think you'll agree this is a must-have and will quickly become your essential "go to" source for information on Colorado's native plants.

Color photographs for nearly 1/3 of the species are also included. This guide will enable students, researchers, amateur and professional botanists to successfully identify Colorado's flora with confidence.

Flors of Colorado is the first new manual of Colorado plants since the 1964 publication of Harrington's Manual of the Florato of Colorado. What does that mean? As defined in Walters & Keit Visculair Flora Tisouncery, 4th ed., "In addition to keys, a manual includes a description for each family, genus, and species, and some manuals provide descriptions for taxa of other ranka as well?"

More funding is needed in order to print the book.
